
Would you believe Gary Rizzo's Futaba transmitter was attacked by Bob Fancher's plane? Bob must not have wanted Gary to fly that day.



New Business: A. Joe Valvo reported on a Flying Breakfast to be held in Hamiliton on Sunday September 22, 1984.


Adjournment:
