THE PREZ SEZ

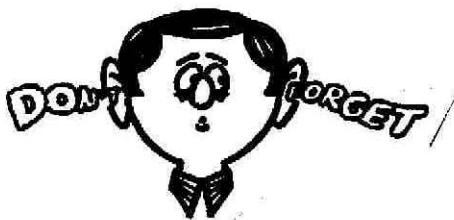
Weil, it's all over for another year, except for the shouting. The

Minutes of 1-9-91 Meeting

12 regular, 2 associate & 1 jr member present. Meeting was called to order by president Dan Williams at 7:07 PM. Minutes of previous meeting were approved. In absence of treasurer, Lon Sauter, treasurers report was presented by Dan Williams & approved.

Association Report: Glenn Gady reported that there were still 4 dealer booths spaces available at this time and that everything looked good.

AMA Report: Lon was unavailable but had sent a 20 minute video tape on AMA safety code to be shown after meeting.

Field Report: Bob Pruger reported a suggestion was made to construct small enclosed building on floating pad. Dan Williams reported that at officers & Board of directors meeting of 1-6-91 it was suggested to put existing building on pad. To discuss later in meeting.

Symposium Committee: Phil Morgan reported he had pipe stands for club booth. Dave Sikorski volunteered to seek drape type material for these stands. Committee to set up booth from 6 go 8 pm on Friday, January 25 included: Dave Sikorski, Art Rose, Scott Deyo, Skip Davis, Bob Wassel, John Papini, Dan Williams. Dan reminded members that the Stars club was responsible for cleanup after the symposium, & encouraged members to assist in manning the booth during the show.

Air Show: Dan stated it was important to keep planes in the air at air show; Suggested time slots for clubs to keep planes in air. Dan suggested handouts of air show program be put on car windshields at Fulton Air Show, and the possibility of having Oswego County Sheriff Dept. Helicopter at air show for static display.

QVM Fun Fly: Dan encouraged club members to take part in this function.

Pylon Racing: Dan reported a sign up sheet at symposium, information in Prop Wash and letters to other clubs would be used to try to raise interest in participation in pylon racing.

Pavillion: Skip Davis reported he knew individual who could suggest structural requirements for floating pad. After discussion, field committee will investigate requirements for floating pad.

Membership: Resignation of Will Waters was accepted and Associate member, Dave Sikorsky was nominated and approved unanimously for full Membership.

Old Business: Phil Morgan reported that Terrells would make a large embroidered club patch for about \$10. Skip Davis reported Creno & Kelly could provide a lined jacket with club patch computerized machine sewn on the jacket with members name included for about \$50-55 (\$75-100 set up fee). Glenn Gady stated he had large unused club patch which could be used for set up. It was suggested Skip secure more info on jackets and also about possibility of caps.

Report of Officers & Bd of Dir meeting of 1-6-91: Dan Williams reported that the Board of Directors resolved that the Stars appoint a Safety Officer/Field Marshall and/or committee to oversee club adherence to AMA safety code. Three areas of concern included instruction program, field flying safety, safety at club events. Discussion followed. Gary Brown suggested group bring ideas concerning this matter to subsequent meeting.

Flight School: Dan reported possibility of assigning students to an instructor with Wednesday set aside for students but allowing instructors to use other nights also. Will schedule meeting of instructors before beginning program. Update of flight log suggested. Sign up for instructors & students and information sheets would be available at symposium booth. Students' planes would be inspected at April meeting.

New Business: Dan Williams reported 3 applications for Associate membership were pending. Motion to increase Associate membership to 13 was defeated. Motion by Doug Harrington to increase Associate membership to 10 was approved. Motion by Art Rose to approve associate membership for Ted Anderson, Red Hoellrich, Hilary Nortz was carried.

Motion by Doug Harrington to mark the 3 men of 174th present for each club meeting while they are in active service overseas and to send them the Prop Wash was passed unanimously.

Mike Graham reported he had been approached by Baldwinsville school teacher connected with area bird club about possibility of setting up blue bird houses on club property. Mike will seek more info.

Art Rose reminded individuals interested in attending Ram Show on Feb. 23 to contact him at 452-0850.

Motion for adjournment was made and seconded at 9:05 pm.

STARTING TIME: 11:00 AM

PLACE: STARS Field, County Route 12. Refreshments will be available at all sessions, if possible.

1991 STARS SPORT PYLON RACING RULES

The purpose of this event is to promote fair competition, on a level that is readily attainable by the average sport flier. All rule interpretations will be handled by the contest director. The primary intention is to keep the competition SAFE, simple, fair, and enjoyable.

The basic rules shall be in accordance with the AMA rules outlined in the section entitled SPORT PYLON (supplemental) class 1 and class 3, with the following exceptions:

CLASS 1

1. .40 cubic inch engines only:
 - a) ball-bearing, non-schneurle ported, any commercial muffler
 - b) non ball-bearing, schneurle ported, stock muffler

SUPER SPORT

1. Sig Super Sport Airplane kit only, no modifications
2. K&B .20 Sportster engine, no modifications
3. 8 X 6 or 9 X 4 propellers only

The R/C Sport Pylon rules are on page 80 of the 1990/1991 AMA rule book. All racing will be done on a full dimension formula pylon course.

Happy New Year INSURANCE UPDATE

Remember—last month's newsletter said there was good news and bad news. Well, it's good news, for sure, this month. You, the members, told the Executive Council what you wanted regarding insurance coverage and they responded positively.

Members and chartered clubs contacted AMA with hundreds of calls and letters during the 1991 membership renewal period expressing their strong displeasure with the 1991 insurance changes. The most significant area of concern centered around removal of member-to-member coverage under the liability policy in 1991.

As a result of a special session, the Executive Council evaluated the impact of the insurance changes and voted *not* to proceed with elimination of member-to-member coverage. This reversal was based *directly* upon your comments, concerns, desires, and willingness to pay increased dues to retain this insurance feature. Late in December, all 1990 and 1991 AMA members were mailed a postcard announcing the reinstatement.

Let's summarize the policy changes effective for *Individual Members* in 1991.

A. GENERAL LIABILITY POLICY—Effective March 31, 1991:

(1) There will be **NO MEMBER-TO-HIS-OWN-FAMILY-MEMBER** coverage regardless of the family member's AMA status. The member-to-family member exclusion applies to both bodily injury and property damage.

(2) The deductible for property damage has been raised from \$50.00 to \$250.00.

B. ACCIDENT/MEDICAL POLICY—Effective January 1, 1991:

(1) A new policy limit of \$25,000 is provided to all 1991 AMA members to cover medical expense reimbursement. *Any* AMA member may file a claim under this policy when injured, regardless of who causes the model operation accident. If you injure your *own* family member, who is also an AMA member, they may collect under this policy.

You may recall that the AMA had previously announced an increased limit to the Accident/Medical policy of \$100,000, but with member-to-member coverage reinstatement, this was readjusted downward to a lower amount. However, this is a significant increase over the 1990 limit of \$7,500.

—All policies remain as secondary coverage for members—

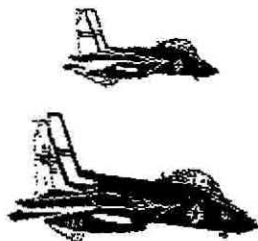
A REVISED Insurance Summary appears on page 5 of this issue and is color coded in yellow for your instant recognition. Please review, retain, and reprint it in your own club newsletter. A Special Notice, printed on page 6, is now being mailed along with all 1991 Membership Cards. This information further clarifies the liability coverage limits in effect until the policy is renewed on March 31.

It is important to note that *your* voice has made a difference in how AMA will provide coverage for model operations. Your concerns are important and directly responsible for Council's reversal. This organization has a renewed appreciation for the member's needs.

Thank you for taking an active interest in your organization. AMA looks forward to providing each of its valued members with continued prompt and caring service.

The January 17, 1991 meeting was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by President Glenn Cady. The secretary read the minutes of the December 20th meeting and they were accepted. Treasurer Lon Sauter reported the following account balances: \$3,079.46 savings account, \$934.78 checking account, \$1,282.02 scholarship fund. With a total of \$5,296.26, the treasurers report was accepted.

Symposium Director Greg Uhlig announced that there would be a discounted rate for people staying at the Farrell Road Holiday Inn as long as they mentioned either the Symposium or Walt's Hobbies. Greg also verified that set-up time for the Symposium would be Friday night from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. and that the building should be open by 7:00 a.m. on Saturday. Jim Abrams reported that all but one of the dealer booths were filled. Dan Williams reported that the club booth floor plan has been completed and sent to all clubs. Penny Abrams reported that all of the public relations letters have been sent out. Walt Blauvelt announced he would once again take charge of Symposium security. Walt Throne reported that he and Greg Uhlig had secured the television advertisements.

Lon Sauter and Dan Williams will man the AMA booth and will be doing transmitter checks for a \$2.00 fee.

Dan Williams reported that Don Cole, the new owner of the Tri-County Mall, was interested in seeing our Symposium and may be having the Association secure a show date from the Tri-County Mall for next years Symposium. This is something the Association will have to consider before making next years arrangements.

The final item on the agenda was that of the scholarship fund and the voting for this years winners.

Walt Throne made a motion for the Association to give \$1,000 total for scholarships this year. This was seconded by Walt Blauvelt and was passed. Walt Throne then motioned to divide the money as follows: one \$500, one \$200, and three \$100 awards. This was seconded by Lon Sauter and passed. The officers read the five scholarship applications and the voting ensued. The following is the results of the voting.
