Minutes of 1-13-91 STARS meeting

17 regular, 2 associate, 1 jr members present. Meeting was called to order by president Dan Williams at 7:03 PM. Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved. Treasurers report was given by Lon Sauter & approved.

Association Report: Dan Williams extended his thanks to all club members who helped set up & man the STARS booth at the symposium. Glen Gady stated he had no further report on the symposium as he had to leave the symposium early due to illness.

AMA report: Lon Sauter announced that he has been designated District 2 Frequency coordinator. Reported concerns at symposium AMA meeting included Futaba Radio discrepancies, AMA insurance changes, and lack of plan for development of new AMA property.

Field Report: Bob Pruger presented an estimate on cement for pavilion pad. Skip Davis reported his source recommended not to use slab without foundation. After discussion, it was decided that field committee (Bob Pruger, Skip Davis, Don Utz, Glen Gady) investigate pavilion and bring proposal for consideration.

Old Business: Skip Davis brought in samples of jackets. He reported set up fee would be \$450. with estimated cost of jacket, including name, at about \$58. He also reported caps with logo would cost about \$15. After discussion, Bob Pruger moved, seconded by Al Mortenson, that \$300. be taken from club treasury to apply toward set up fee for jackets and that a \$10. surcharge be added to price of each jacket to go to club to replace club outlay. After discussion, the motion was carried.

Safety Committee: Matter was tabled to next meeting.

Blue Bird Houses: Dan Williams reported he had been contacted by Biville teacher on this matter and he will seek more information.

New Business: March 3 Snow fly was discussed. Lon Sauter & Glen Gady volunteered for kitchen duty. Dave Skiorski volunteered to run lapound.

Pylon racing: Committee of Dan Williams, Phil Morgan, Dave Skiorski, will set up race dates.

Flight School: Trainees will be invited to bring planes to March & April club meetings for inspections. Art Rose, Phil Morgan, Dave Skiorski, Dan Williams were designated flight school committee members.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:40 PM.

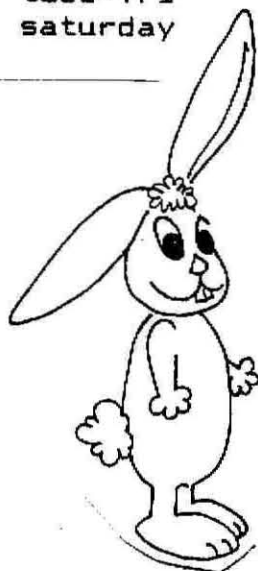

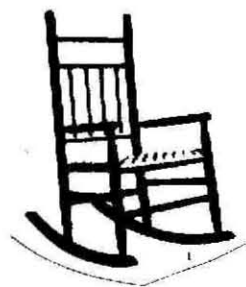
