Minutes of 6-12-91 STARS Meeting

18 Members, 9 Associate Members, 2 Junior Members, 3 Guests present. Meeting was called to order by acting president, Dave Sikorski, at 7:02 PM. Minutes of May meeting were approved. Treasurer's report was given by Dave Sikorski and approved. Applications of Ed Mervine for associate membership and Chris O'Connell for junior membership were discussed and approved.

AMA Report: None

Association Report: Phil Morgan reported association was investigating presentation of plaques in appreciation for outstanding members. Next association meeting 6-20-91 at ARCS field. Association looking into ice cooled soda machine for member clubs' use. \$1000 set aside for annual picnic. \$2000 set aside for purchase of computer & printer. Anyone with leads for source of purchase should contact Dan Williams with info. New association officers: Rick Snyder, pres; Dan Williams, VP; John Kinnon, Sec.; Lon Sauter, treas.

Field Report: Bob Prugger reported that of the \$1000 allocated for field improvements, \$560, plus cost of peat moss, has thus far been spent for this purpose. It was suggested that additional topsoil would be purchased later in the season when conditions would be more favorable for new grass. Lisle Snow requested field committee investigate gate for field entrance and idea of cutting bushes & trees around field. Bob Frugger will set up a work party for brush & tree cutting. Interested individuals were requested to give names to Bob so they would be contacted as to date of this activity. The July field mowing schedule was passed around for sign-ups.

Field Safety: Dave Sikorski brought up matter of a member flying on channel 45 at field. Members are reminded that odd frequency channels of 11 through 33 continuously and channel 59 are the only odd channels allowed at the field as approved at the 4-10-91 meeting. Mike Graham suggested allowable channels be included on membership applications and that allowable channels at field be published in block section in Prop wash. Motion by Mike Graham to order Ace frequency flag identifier kit for all frequencies to be used at field was approved.

Flight School: Dave Sikorski reported 22 trainees were taking part in the flight training program. Two trainees, Mark O'Connel and Ted Anderson have successfully soloed. Motion by Doug Harrington to purchase 10 sets of AMA pilot wings to be presented to graduating flight trainees was defeated.

Pylon Racing: Dave Sikorski reminded all that the first racing date was Sunday, June 16 with racing to begin at 11:00 AM. He reminded all that assistants were needed for pylon judges and timers.

Old Business: Dave Sikorski reported inexpensive mower belts did not hold up but more expensive belt has been holding up so far. It was suggested the center of flying field be moved with mowing deck at lowest level; sides of field & pit areas be moved at medium level; all other areas be moved at highest deck level. Field should only be moved when grass is dry. The old tractor currently has a broken deck and is not in service.

There was discussion on possibility of purchasing a used sickle-bar mover or some other type of mover for heavy growth areas. Possibility of renting a sickle-bar mover to see if such mover would do the job was suggested. Motion by Phil Morgan to (1) ask neighbor farmers if they could mow the heavy growth areas & if no takers, (2) club rent a machine to cut heavy growth areas was approved.

New Business: Dave Sikorski reminded members the STARS/OVM picnic was scheduled for 6-23-91 at OVM field and that STARS was to supply sods, cups & plates. Mike Graham suggested OVM's be contacted to get idea of expected attendance. All members were encouraged to attend. Club Jackets: Phil Morgan reported 10 jackets were purchased thus far by members. He has two orders pending but needs 2 more as orders must be in groups of four. Phil showed cap with logo which may be purchased for \$15. Contact Phil with any orders for jackets or caps. AIR SHOW: Dave Sikorski reminded STARS air show was scheduled for 9-1-91. Possibility for display at show of sherriff Dept. or State police helicopter was being investigated. Member Bob Goldworthy offered to display his ultralight plane at show. Tentative show volunteers included: Lon Sauter & Bob Elkovitch, food preparation; Phil Morgan & Gary Brown, announcing; Dave Sikorski, impound; Bob Purgger & Don Utz, parking; Lisle Snow, Swap shop. Motion by Lisle Snow to purchase ARF from Lon Sauter for raffle at show was approved. Don Rasmussen volunteered to build this plane for raffle. Additional new business: Club member Bob Goldworthy requested club permission to fly his ultralight plane from STARS field for period of several years. He proposed he would build a hangar for approximately \$3500 (pole barn construction) which would be donated to club when he stopped using field. (two 10' X 12' areas of hangar would be available for club use) Lisle Snow brought up concerns of building permit, planning board regulations and possible increased tax liabilities. Bob offered to pay difference of tax increase liability incurred, if any, durring his use of field. Mike Graham suggested he contact Bob Rowe concerning insurance & liability implications of this matter. Further discussion on this matter was suggested for next meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 8:55 PM.

However, we will eventually have to change that decision if the AMA gets pressure from the FCC to use the odd channels or lose them. For that, we'll have to wait and see.

Another issue was the possible purchase of a sicle bar mower. This has been resolved by our very kind farmer neighbor next door. He will cut down the areas we wish, and will chop up, turn over, and rake the areas so we can set them up for future controlled growth. This, of course, will be discussed and

decided upon at our next meeting.

Poor Dave. He really had his hands full with discussions last month. Mike Goldsworthy asked the club for permission to erect a pole barn hangar on the field for his ultralight. There is much to be considered here. Mike is checking into insurance and zoning, and will report back. This is going to be a tough issue. Like I said before, I will support what the club wants, as long as the welfare of the club is not in danger. So, we'll proceed with common sense and caution.

This month, we will hit the Air Show agenda real hard. I want everything scheduled out, all committees formed, and all other Air Show issues to be resolved by the end of this meeting. I need the total support of all members for this. Last year I pulled a lot of this together myself. I also promised myself never to do it myself again. So, if this is to be successful, I expect everyone to do their fair share. This is your club, so support it. This is our only major event. It has to be right. Please, pitch in.

Addendum I

Important Notice:

In accordance with the club meeting of April 1991, all odd numbered radio frequencies between channel 34 and channel 58 will not be authorized for use at the S.T.A.R.S. flying field.

The following channels are restricted from use: 35,37,39,41,43,45,47,49,51,53,55,57

In addition, the operating frequency of the transmitter will be indicated by displaying the corresponding channel number in a channel identification plaque. The plaque will display two black channel digits on a white background and will be attached anywhere on the transmitter antenna.

The frequency band in use will also be identified by a colored wind streamer that states "72 MHz — Aircraft Use Only". It also may be attached anywhere along the

transmitter antenna.
