Gus Pandajis reported that he will begin a rough draft of the flyer for the 93 Symposium.


Walt Throne made a motion to have uniformed security gaurds at the doors. Ed Zobel seconded and the motion passed.



(SPORT CLASS PYLON RACING RULES AND REGULATIONS)


- 1. ALL FORMS OF SPORT OR TRAINER AIRCRAFT WILL BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE (EXCEPT FOR FORMULA 1 PYLON RACERS)
- 2. AIRCRAFT SPECIFICATIONS.


ENGINE TOTAL DISPLACEMENT	MINIMUM WING AREA
CUBIC INCHES	SQUARE INCHES
.25	375
.35	450
.40	500
.50	550
. 62	610
. 90	800

FOR ENGINE SIZE RETWEEN LISTED SIZES, USE THE NEXT LARGER WING AREA.

- THE ENGINE MUST HAVE A MUFFLER (NO TUNE PIPES WILL BE-ALLOWED).
- 4. ALL AIRCRAFT MUST HAVE LANDING BEAR. ANY AIRCRAFT THAT HAS RETRACTABLE GEAR MUST HAVE THE BEAR EXTENDED THROUGH BUT THE RAIE.
- 5. A ROUNDED SPINNER IS REQUIRED ON ALL AIRCRAFT.
- 4. PILOT MUST BE ABLE TO SHUT OFF ENGINE BY RADIO CONTROL.
- 7. ONLY FIXED-PITCH, TWO SLADED WOOD OR COMPRESSION MOLDED, CONTINUOUS-FIRER GLASS-STRAND PLASTIC PROPLERS SHALL DE PERMITTED. INJECTED-MOLDED PROPS ARE NOT ALLOWED.
- 8. WORKMANSHIP MUST BE UF SATISFACTORY STANDARDS. THE CD OR HIS APPOINTED REPRESENTATIVES SHALL BE EMPOWERED TO REFUSE PERMISSION TO FLY OR DISQUALIFY ANY AIRCRAFT WHICH, IN THEIR OPINION, IS NOT UP TO RESONABLE SAFE STANDARDS IN EITHER MATERIALS, WORKMANSHIP, DESIGN DETAILS, RADIO INSTALLATION, OR CONDITION AS THE RESULT OF DAMAGE.
- 7. FUEL WILL BE PROVIDED AND IT WILL BE 10% NITRO MIX.
- IV. ALL RACERS MUST HAVE A UP TO DATE AMA CARD.
- 11. THE RACE WILL CONSIST OF 10 LAPS AROUND THE COURSE.
- 19. THE AIRCRAFT MUST USE FRONT ROTARY RC ENGINES WITH AN RADIO CONTROL CARBURETOR.

### Idle Chatter about



Below is a letter I sent to Bill Brennan after several discussions with Great Planes Inc. I encourage all members to write to Ken at the address on the bottom exspressing you views as to the validity of having a hobby shop with their product in our area.

Dear Mr. Brennen:

I would like to relate to you conversations I have had with Great

Planes on behalf of Airplane Modelers in central New York.
During the last week of July 1992 I called Great Planes and talk with a representative (Marie) asking why Brennen's RC was not allowed a dealership. I was informed that your store did not meet certain qualifications one of which was dealers selling from their homes have no overhead and were undercutting other hobby or potential hobby I explained to her that both those item were not true.

Your store is not in your home and you obviously have overhead.
Your prices are competitive with other hobby stores.

She also mentioned other criterion such as full time, you are; store front, you are on commercial, highly traveled, centrally located area.

At the end of the conversation she said she would review your file and be in touch with you.

You related to me that they did call you and refused to accept you store for a dealership because you are rural.

I called Ken Cutler, general manager of Great Planes, on Aug. 3, 1992 to attempt a to clarify the reason you were denied a dealership so that I may respond to club members and Airplane Modelers in the area.

Mr. Cutler explained the same qualifications you would need and he added that your motive for opening the store was suspect. His claim is that you "Mr. Brennen opened his store to

sell products slightly above his cost to his friends."

I told Mr. Cutler that did not appear to be the case because your prices are competive ( higher than tower for example) and you sell to everyone.

I told him that you appear to have opened your hobby store to serve the many RC airplane modelers in the area. There is not a more complete hobby shop for more than 50 miles from this central New York area.

Mr. Cutler proceeded to say "I can sell to any damn shop I please." I did try to get oweners names because it seems a poor way to do business by antagonizing customers and avoiding a growing market. As president of the Mohawk Valley Modeleres and acting on their behalf I will distribute this letter to the members of our local clubs encourging them to write Ken Cutler, Great Planes, PD Box 9021 Champaign, Illinois, 61826-9021 expressing their displeasure with
