executed. The push was to sign up new members, but not on retention.

The Leader Member Committee Chairman sent a pier to pier letter explaining the retention issues that were compiled from the membership drive:

- Club dues and initiation fees are too high. AMA renewal and club dues are due around the holidays.
- Club meetings are stagnant.
- Cliques in the club centered on skill or ability to outspend others.
- New members felt they were being snubbed by older members. Ignorance or lack of skill looked down upon.
- Club membership intolerant of change.
- Conduct by members at the field that alienated others and made family in attendance uncomfortable.
- Events that don't allow for newbies. Intolerant of lack of resources or limited skill. Design events so that everyone has a chance to compete.
- Lack of a formal club orientation and welcome.
- Does the club news letter provide the content you need and/or encourage you to attend a meeting? Does the news letter grab your attention? If it doesn't grab your attention, how is it going to get a potential new member's attention? What can you do to help- pictures, articles, etc.

Re-post of the Long Range Planning Committee Projects

The long range planning committee met 01/06 at Walt's.

Club members in attendance were Bob Rowe, Roy Fields, Chuck LeVine, Phil Morgan, Peter Seiffert, and Jeff Wolsley

Several topics were discussed. The summary of the proposed improvements (in no order of priority) are:

- 1. Get rid of the impound.
- 2. Pay off remaining open club shares.
- 3. Propane storage for the grills.
- 4. Add a door to the club house for access to out door grilling area.
- 5. Add a 10' x 10' crushed stone pad for the grills.
- 6. Seavan container to replace the old shed. Locate closer to the existing shed and pavilion.

Clean up the area behind the old shed. Disposal of old shed.

- 7. Continue port-a-potty rental for 2010.
- 8. Look at a more permanent lave facility. Club use only, not for events. Envirolet toilet?
- 9. Reconfigure pilot pad layout. Add a fourth front position. Eliminate the rear positions.
- 10. Fence repair. Replace sagging top tube and fix end anchors. Re-tension the chain link.
- 11. Add two (2) electrical circuits to pavilion.
- 12. Look into a concrete pad for the driveway between the road and culvert to eliminate rutting.

Some of the projects can be done easily and at no cost like the pilot pad reconfiguration, or getting rid of the impound. Some projects are a necessity like moving the grills outside.

Indoor flying at the Oswego YMCA Armory will start up in October.

The current schedule will be posted either on the AMA District 2 calendar or the Hawks Website.

We had several discussions about how things went last year. In trying to get more young people involved this year we feel it's the right time to make a few changes. We decided to get smaller and spread out the times.

Here are some of the changes:

- 1. The Y changed our Tuesday night time for this year. We'll be flying from 7:15 to 9:30 this year. 2. We've split up the "Slow Flyer" category into two categories- "FF / Micro" & "Slow Flyers".
- 3. Flying times will now be 15 minutes each (depending on attendance)
- 0-15 minute mark (Choppers, the smaller the better)
- 15-30 minute mark (Micro or FF, Rubber included) for planes up to Parkflyer Citabria/Cessna size
- 30 45 minute mark (3D)
- 45 60 minute mark (SLOW FLYERS) From Parkflyer Citabria size and up including foamy choppers.

4. The indoor season will run from Oct 2008 up to and including March 2009 9:00pm until 9:30 will be open flying, again depending on traffic.

AMA still required to fly.
