Secretary's Report:

The January 2011 STARS regular meeting was called to order by STARS President, **Chuck LeVine**, at 7:04 pm. There were **8** Full members, **4** Associate member, **0** youth members, and **2** guests in attendance.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: The Secretary's Report from the November meeting was submitted. Motion to approve by Mike Graham and 2nd by Roy Fields. Carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Chuck LeVine (For Bob Rowe)

Taxes are due. Club dues are at about 90% paid. Treasurer's Report motion to accept by Bill Orr and 2nd by Mike Graham. Carried.

Committee Reports:

<u>Field Committee</u>: Chuck LeVine (For Carl Moore)

The group is in good shape financially. Volunteers are needed for the field group. A tractor School will be held for the new volunteers.

Roy Fields will contact the beaver slayer. Should be starting up around mid Feb.

AMA: Peter Seiffert, AMA District II, AVP

A webinar was held for the AVP's on 12/29. There was information on UAPO (unmanned aircraft) from the FAA. It has been in development for 2 ½ yrs. Sometime around 2013 the regulations are slated to go into affect.

There are two parts to this-

- 1- Commercial use
- 2- Recreational use

Commercial use is intended to cover unmanned aircraft used commercially for aerial photography, surveying, etc. Recreational use covers model aircraft and toys.

The AMA feels that most of the regulations will be transparent to us as modelers. There should be no impact on park flyers.

The concerns raised in the webinar are how to handle events like flyaways- utilizing failsafe programming in the transmitters and receivers.

How to handle high powered aircraft- turbine/jet powered.

High altitude flying typically greater than 400ft such as free flight and sailplanes.

Proximity to an airport. A better definition of an airport is required. R/C flyers that share an airport with full scale aircraft will need special consideration

Proposed changes are weight limits- 55# + aircraft will have a large scale designation rather than experimental. Aircraft greater than 75# will require an AMA designation waiver.

Conclusion- The FAA is impressed with the AMA organization and the representation of its membership.

The webinar is on the AMA website and is approximately 1:45 long. It was/is hosted by Dave Mathewson, Jim Rice, and Richard Hansen

Peter concluded with the MOST volunteer request. The next presentation will be on 02/05. Please contact Peter to volunteer.

Long Range Projects:

No topics discussed. Your ideas are needed. Please bring them with you to the next meeting, or e-mail them in to any of the STARS Officers

Safety Officer Report: Peter Seiffert

We have seen several instances lately of the Walkera and Novus RC equipment binding to other then the intended transmitter. This system binds a little bit different then Futaba, JR or Spectrum. With the Walkera and Novus system the pilot must turn on the receiver first then turn on the transmitter for binding every time the system is powered up. If two pilots turn on the receiver at the same time and then turn on the transmitter the receiver will pick the first transmitter it finds. I have been in contact with AMA about this problem and they are doing

some testing. The Walkera and Novus systems are CE and FCC approved and I believe the systems are good, just be very careful when powering up these systems. There have also been instances when two pilots are trying to bind the JR or

Spectrum at the same time and the receivers bind to two transmitters. Please be very careful during the binding process no matter what RC system you are using, check and recheck to be sure everything is working properly before flying.

In addition Peter reported that there is imported radio equipment that is coming in that is not FCC/CE approved and in some cases has forged documentation included with the equipment. If this type of equipment shows up at the field, it needs to be impounded immediately. The club needs to look at restricting this equipment from the field.





STARS Field Safety Rules

1. General:

- A. License: All pilots, students, and flying guests must have a current membership in a nationally recognized model aircraft association in order to fly.
- B. Spectators: Only those people essential to flight operations will be permitted in the pit area; all others will remain on the spectator side of the fence.
- C. Impound: All pilots, students, and flying guests must place their transmitter(s) in the impound area immediately upon arriving at the field.
 - D. Vehloles: Vehloles will not be permitted on the flying field.
- E. Crach Debric: Pliots must retrieve all pieces of their aircraft after a crach. Particularly, attention must be made to obtaining all pieces of aircraft that land in the neighboring fields under outtivation.
 - F. Trach: All members will take home their own trach.
- G. Alcoholio Beverages: Members will not consume alcoholio beverages prior to, nor during, participation in any modeling operations.
 - H. Smoking: Smoking will not be permitted in the pit area or on the flight line.
- Mowing: Flying on the field will not be permitted if the field is being mowed or maintenanced.
- J. PPMP: Those pilots participating in the Park Pilot Membership Program must fly models that weigh two pounds or less and be incapable of reaching speeds greater than 60 mph. They must be electric or rubber powered, or of any similar quiet means of propulsion.

2. Transmitters:

- A. Frequency Control (For non 2.4 GHz transmitters only): All members, students, and guests must make use of the field frequency control system. Each pilot will obtain the correct frequency flag (or pin) from the impound board and attach it to his/her transmitter before attempting to fiv.
- B. Range Checks: Each pilot will conduct a successful radio equipment ground range check before flying a new or repaired aircraft and prior to each flying session .

3. Engines:

- A. All internal combuction engines run at the field will have a silencer (except for small displacements of .09 ouble inches or less).
 - B. When running an engine in the pits, keep neighboring personnel behind the prop arc.

4. Flying:

- A. Boundaries: Flying over the pit area or the spectator side of the fence is prohibited, unless beyond the control of the pilotis).
 - B. Taxing: Taxing is prohibited in the pit area!
 - C. Flying:
 - (1). Pliots will initiate their first turn after takeoff away from the pit and spectator areas.
 - (2). Engines will not be started before 9 AM Monday through Saturday and 11 AM on Sunday, unless approved by the Event Director.
 - (3). No more than three aircraft will be permitted in the air at one time.
 - (4). All fiving will be conducted from the decignated flight boxes.
 - (6). Hand launching of aircraft is prohibited from the pits.
 - (8). Flight operations will sease during electrical storms.

5. Guests:

- A. All guests must have a current membership in a nationally recognized model aircraft association in order to fiv.
- B. Guests may fly at the field only with the approval of a member in good standing and only as long as a sponsoring member remains at the field. Guests will not fly unattended.
- C. A local guest will be allowed to fly at the field on three (3) separate occasions and then will be asked to join the Club.
- D. An out-of-town guest may make arrangements with the Club to fly at the field while visiting the area. The Club Officers and the Safety Officer will handle each out-of-town visitor on a case-by-case basis.
- E. All guests are required to extend every courtesy to current members sharing the same flying frequency. But when there is a conflict over who shall fly, the Club member will have the first option to fly. Both the guest and the members should use common sense while sharing the flight line or using the same radio frequencies.
